Course Objective:

Class participation (Individual):

Classes will be conducted in a participative manner. Students are to prepare for classes, including and especially reading the cases, and participate actively in class discussions.

Cases

Cases will be used throughout the modules.

Case Presentation (Individual and Group)

Each group will present answers to one of the case studies. Individual and group presentation components are 10% and 5% respectively.

Case Report I and II (Group)

Each group will provide written reports on 2 case studies (other than the case the group presented).

Individual Research Assignment (Individual)

Each student will choose a topic to research on and write a professional report on it.

Individual Presentation Assignment (Individual)

Each student will record a personal video recording of the Individual Research Assignment.

Points to Note:
