Overview

This module employs tools from microeconomic analysis to explain the urbanization process and the operation of real estate markets. The topics include economic factors driving city formation; market forces shaping the urban spatial structure; determinants of metropolitan and regional growth; quality of life measurements; urban sprawl and skyscrapers; urban transportation; neighbourhoods and racial/income segregation; land-use regulations; and urban governance.

Students will be able to apply urban economic theories and approaches to understand the factors behind urban growth and decline. Students will be able to apply urban economic theories and approaches to understand the spatial sorting of urban activities as well as the internal structure of a city. Students will learn the policy solutions of urban problems.
