#### Overview

This course applies principles of economics to study the economics of cities. The module starts with the economic forces shaping the urban economy and forming the equlibrium market outcomes. Subsequent topics include urban spatial structure, determinants of urban growth, urban transportation, and cities in the context of globalization. The delivery emphasizes Singapore's contexts, while the elaboration may be supplemented with international examples.

## **Learning Outcomes**

Students can apply urban economic theories to understand reasons contributing to growth or decline of world's important cities. They will be able to appreciate how Singapore worked through its journey and arrived at the current situation as a city state. They can comprehend the basics of Singapore's future growth strategy and understand the ways to shape a cities with productivity, movability, and livability.
